Coldhurst Ward: An Introduction


Coldhurst Is a very compact and densely populated neighbourhood whose main residential areas are to the north and west of Oldham Town Centre. Public transport links are excellent with a number of Metrolink stations, plus the Oldham Bus Station; which is Oldham's stop for the National Express. The town centre is undergoing significant redevelopment with an ambition of creating a new neighbourhood of 2,000 new homes, a new town centre park, the new Eton Star sixth form, the redevelopment of Spindles shopping centre, and the refurbished Old Library. A new high/secondary school opened off Middleton Road in September 2023.


Since 2020 the town centre has had an increase in 'informal' residential occupancy, mainly in flats above commercial properties, due to the demand for temporary accommodation. The demolition of Summervale and Crossbank tower blocks took place in 2022 reducing the number of one and two bedroom accommodation available, the development of 88 new homes on the site commenced soon after with the first homes due to be available Winter 2024 to Spring 2025.

Top Coldhurst and Barker Street are on the 'hill' up to Oldham Edge and are predominantly social housing managed by First Choice Homes Oldham (FCHO). This is an appealing area for residents due to its proximity to the Town Centre and easy access to local amenities. The recent (2023) ward boundary change has brought the neighbouring St Mary's estate into the ward, which is also mainly social housing managed by FCHO and Onward Homes. These neighbourhoods have undergone a noticeable demographic shift, as people from different backgrounds have moved into estates that have traditionally been mainly older white British.

Coldhurst and Westwood is made up of the neighbourhoods that run 'down' from Rochdale Road, across Featherstall Road and down to the border with Chadderton. The housing is mixed with a lot of privately owned terraced homes. Many residents here have a strong sense of identity and there is a vibrant local economy. Residents are proud of where they live and families have aspirations for their children to be successful. There is a high demand and reliance on public services, with a perception that many things should be managed and delivered by the local authority.

There are generational tensions in the area as young peoples' values can be at odds with the traditional community values. Many young people see self-employment as the main route to affluence.





Reported Crimes per year: % of population






Crime Map Information

Trust Map Information


The map to the left shows data from work by the 'Onward' organisation that measures social trust. They surveyed residents, asking if others could be trusted.

Where values are positive (coloured green), people tended to trust more. Negative values (red) are where people tend not to trust others.


Grey areas are mainly or wholly in a different ward. The areas are Middle Super Output Areas (statistical areas)


